The BJC and its members have been very involved in several issues affecting the Jewish Community in Bedford. This included response to an act of anti-semitism at JGMS and an anti-Israel book included on a list of 7<sup>th</sup> grade literature. Both of these issues had the effect of drawing the Bedford Jewish Community in to help foster understanding and to take direct action.

Another example where we were able to foster awareness concerns Bedford Day. The Town contacted me as they normally have Bedford Day on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of September. This year it would fall on Rosh Hashanah – result? They are going to move Bedford Day (but yes it is still on Shabbat).

Jewish issues in Bedford, fun, entertainment and exciting programs do not just happen. They need someone to run them. We need some folks to help step up and contribute. We are not asking for much, but things as simple as hosting an event would help the Bedford Jewish Community.

Over the past two years we have had many adult events and not as many events for families of younger children. We will continue with our adult events, but wanted to make sure everyone knew that we are ready and able to assist in the next family event.
